#### Rudder FFA Receives Top Honors at Texas FFA Convention

**Corpus Christi, Texas** – The Rudder FFA Chapter was recognized as a gold-level chapter for the esteemed Golden Horizon award in the multi-teacher division at the 87th annual Texas FFA State Convention held July 13-17 in Corpus Christi.

The gold-level Golden Horizon award is the highest state rating to be bestowed upon a Texas FFA chapter. Golden Horizon award selection is based on exceptional chapter involvement and activities within the school and community.

The Golden Horizon award recognizes well-rounded chapter involvement that promotes maximum participation, in order to deliver all facets of the agricultural education program. The Rudder FFA Chapter was the fifth highest rated chapter out of the 1,032 FFA Chapters in the state this year. Rudder FFA was organized when the high school opened in the 2008-2009 school year with 39 FFA members. There are currently 419 FFA members at Rudder, making the chapter the 25th largest in the state. There are more FFA members in the Rudder Chapter than in four other State FFA Associations.





## Rudder FFA Chapter Receives National Chapter Rating at Texas FFA State Convention

The Rudder FFA Chapter received the prestigious Gold Emblem rating at the 87th annual Texas FFA State Convention.

The Gold Emblem rating is only bestowed upon the top 10 percent of FFA chapters in Texas. Gold Emblem FFA chapters advance to the national level to be judged for the National FFA Chapter Contest.

Chapters that received the Gold Emblem rating actively implemented the FFA mission and strategies. These chapters improve their operations by using a Program of Activities, which emphasizes student, chapter, and community development.

## Katherine Fazzino named Champion at Texas FFA Agriscience Fair

Katherine Fazzino, of the Rudder FFA Chapter, was named as the Champion in the Texas FFA Agriscience Fair at the 87th annual Texas FFA State Convention held July 13-17 in Corpus Christi.

Fazzino participated in the Plant Science category. The Agriscience Fair fuses the traditional science fair with agriculture. FFA members conduct cutting edge agricultural research to compete in categories such as biochemistry and microbiology, environmental science, zoology, botany and engineering.

The Agriscience Fair was made possible by the ExxonMobil Corporation. State award winners in each category will receive a \$1,000 scholarship from the Richard Wallrath Education Foundation. Fazzino will also advance to the National FFA Convention Agriscience Fair competition in Louisville, Kentucky in October.

Also competing in the State FFA Agriscience Fair from Rudder were Myles Martinez in the Ag Power and Technology division, Alexandra Alderete in the Social Science Division, and Trenton Llewellyn in the Animal Science division.





## Jayce Wilder named State winner for Crop Production Proficiency Award

Jayce Wilder of the Rudder FFA Chapter was awarded the Crop Production Proficiency Award at the 87th annual Texas FFA State Convention held July 13-17 in Corpus Christi.

The Proficiency Awards program encourages members to set personal goals and learn practical skills. The program provides recognition to FFA members for exceptional accomplishments and excellence in their Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) program. Wilder's application won both district and area competitions before being considered by the state-selected committee in early June. Wilder received a \$1,000.00 scholarship and advances to the National FFA Convention Competition in October in Louisville, Kentucky.

The Supervised Agricultural Experience program is an individualized application of classroom learning beyond scheduled class time and has been a standard part of agricultural education since 1917. Students' SAEs may be entrepreneurial enterprises, employment experiences or research projects.

Other Rudder FFA members competing in the Proficiency Award competitions were Katherine Fazzino –  $2^{nd}$  in Agriscience, Jayce Wilder –  $2^{nd}$  in Diversified Crop Production, Annie Perez –  $3^{rd}$  in Ag Education, Reagan Thurman –  $4^{th}$  in Goat Production, Samantha Ruffino –  $4^{th}$  in Vet Medicine, Alexandra Alderete –  $5^{th}$  in Poultry Production, and Spencer Wilder –  $6^{th}$  in Beef Production.

Katherine Fazzino, of the Rudder FFA Chapter, has been named the Star Chapter FFA Degree in Agriscience. Star award winners were recognized at the 87th annual Texas FFA State Convention held July 13-17 in Corpus Christi.

The state award winner in each category will receive a \$1,000 Dina Wallrath-Robertson Memorial Star Scholarship made available by the Texas FFA Foundation. Star Awards are given at each degree level in four categories: Placement, Production, Agribusiness and Agriscience.



FFA Stars are chosen based on the most outstanding Supervised Agriculture Experience Program within their respective degree and category. Winners maintain a comprehensive record keeping system to help justify and explain their Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) project. The state winners have already won their respective Star Divisions at the District and Area levels to advance to the state level. Other Rudder FFA members that won their Star Division at District and Area competitions and were recognized as State Finalists on stage at the convention were, Reagan Thurman – Star Finalist for Star Chapter Degree in Production, Jayce Wilder for Star American Degree in Placement, and Spencer Wilder for Star American Degree in Production.
